PROFILE OF THE SOCIETY

The society, 'Association for Learning Performing Arts and Normative Action' is registered with the Registrar of Societies, Govt. of NCT of Delhi under the Societies Registration Act 1860 vide No. S-48001 of 2003-04. It is also registered as a Voluntary Organization with the Planning Commission of India. It has Income Tax Exemption Certificate under 80G IT Act and foreign contribution certificate under FCR Act.

The mission of the society is promotion of performing arts and facilitating holistic human development. The society essays the cause of spreading awareness among today's youth about rich cultural heritage of India. Through various art forms like music and dance and other courses painting, tabla playing etc., the society endeavors to evolve complete individuals proud of their heritage. The **emphasis is on our inclusive and composite heritage**. The society has also pledged to work on many socially relevant issues through research and analysis, documentation, dissemination, building human and intellectual capital and assisting policy formulation and advice. It functions as a not-for-profit voluntary agency, which undertakes projects for improving and securing the quality of life of people and creates awareness for sustainability.

Activities of the Society

The society has been organizing major events during the last several years and students of Gurus associated with the society have performed at national and international events. The Gurus associated with the Society run regular classes on dance (Odissi, Western, Folk), music (singing, keyboard, tabla, harmonium), drawing, painting, clay-modelling, candle-making, tailoring, office stationery making etc. The society works for the empowerment and mainstreaming of Divyangjan (Persons with disabilities) A.L.P.A.N.A. institute is a unique integrated institute where both challenged and non-challenged students get training in dance, music, drawing, painting and different craft works without any segregation.

ACTIVITIES DURING 2003-06: During this period the society organized six events. The first one was on April 25 2004 in the Kamani Auditorium, New Delhi where Guru Alpana Nayak presented an Odissi Dance recital. Shri K. Jayakumar, IAS, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Culture, Government of India was the Chief Guest. On 7 May 2004 the society organised its first Annual Day event Indradhanush 2004 at the L.T.G. Auditorium, New Delhi, where all students including Specially Gifted students (Mentally & Physically challenged) presented a cultural evening. Mr. N.P. Tripathy, IRS, DG Income Tax, New Delhi, Dr Satbir Silas Bedi, IAS, Government of NCT of Delhi and Guru Hare Krishna Behera attended the event as Chief Guest and Distinguished Guests. Our special students performed at the International Youth Day celebrated at the India International Centre, New Delhi on 11 August 2004 and got standing ovation from the audience. The students of our Gurus also performed at Janmastami festival at Ghaziabad and at Virasat Festival, Dehradun, Uttaranchal. Guru Alpana Nayak presented new choreography in Odissi style on 16 November 2004 at India Habitat Centre, New Delhi. Mr Wajahat Habibullah, IAS, Secretary Textiles, Government of India was the Chief Guest and Miss S. Aparna, IAS, Ministry of Urban Development, Govt of India was the Guest of Honour.

To our credit, Miss Ayushi and Miss Akriti Tyagi two talented disciples of Guru Smt. Alpana Nayak participated in the All-Delhi Classical Dance Competition organized by MTNL at Talkatora Indoor Stadium and Miss Ayushi bagged the first prize.

In May 2005 the society organised second Annual Day event **Indradhanush 2005** at SAI International Auditorium, New Delhi where all students including specially gifted students (Mentally

& Physically challenged) presented variety of cultural programmes. The event was inaugurated by Ms Sushma Chaudhary, IAS, Special Advisor, Planning Commission of India and presided over by Padmashri Smt. Madhavi Mudgal, Odissi Exponent. Our students performed at three national level performing arts events organized in NCR Delhi and on 14 November 2005 Guru Alpana Nayak presented Odissi dance at Poorva Sanskritik Kendra, Delhi. Smt Jayanti Pattanayak, former Chairperson of the National Commission for Women, was the Chief Guest and Mrs Anuradha Mall, IAS, Ministry of HRD, Government of India was the Guest of Honour. On 30 December 2005 Guru Alpana Nayak presented Pancha Nayika - an Odissi ballet at India International Centre, New Delhi where Shri B.L. Joshi, the Lt Governor of Delhi was the Chief Guest.

To our credit, all the students of our organization won laurels in All-India Dance and Music examinations conducted by Gandharva Mahavidyalaya Mandal, Maharashtra.

In December 2009, Guru Smt A.L.P.A.N.A. Nayak performed Odissi at Nungambakkam Arts Festival, Chennai. In January 2010, our organization received invitation from the Embassy of the Russian Federation to explore the possibility of working in the area of disability and performing arts in collaboration with NGOs based in Russia.

ACTIVITIES DURING 2010-11: In July 2010, we celebrated INDRADHANUSH 2010 at Poorva Sanskritik Kendra (PSK), New Delhi where our special children performed classical as well as folk dance and music along with other children. Noted Odissi Danseuse Smt. Geeta Mahalik presided over the function, Shri Rakesh Jain, Financial Advisor, Ministry of Power, Government of India was the Chief Guest and Ms. Roopa Srinivasan, Director, Ministry of culture, Government of India was the Guest of Honour of the event.

Our NGO got affiliation/recognition by Indira Gandhi National Open Univeristy (IGNOU). When natural calamities stroke LEH, LADAKH in August 2010 our members, students, parents and well-wishers went from door to door in Delhi to collect huge amounts of relief materials which was airlifted to Leh with kind cooperation of Resident Commissioner of J&K, Deputy Commissioner Leh and Kingfisher Airlines.

The event was organized at India International Centre, New Delhi on 13 & 14 November. SAMBHAV 2010 included: i. International Seminar on "Inclusive Performing Arts and Dance as Therapy for challenged persons"; ii. International Exhibition of paintings and artifacts made by challenged artists, iii. International Centre, by participating groups and iv. Visit to a special school situated in the National Capital Region by participants from abroad. HE the Governor of UP, Shri B.L. Our student Master Abhisekh Rana got First Prize in painting competition organised by NMNH in February 2011.
