Rangotsav is an Art & Craft workshop for challenged people. Association for Learning Performing Arts & Normative Action (A.L.P.A.N.A.) in collaboration with National Museum of Natural History (NMNH) under the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India organized two days workshop for the specially talented children. Sixty challenged students (including ten blind students) from different schools of the national capital took part in the workshop with lots of enthusiasm. The aim of the workshop was to enable those students in some recreational and educational skills such as drawing, painting, craft, envelope-making, carry bag making, clay modeling and origami.

The children were divided in different groups so that they could learn various activities at the same day.

On the first day these specially children learnt - Drawing, colouring and painting, Origami work and craft work. It was great to see the result of their efforts in the form of beautiful paintings, clay models, pen holders and dolls.

The very first day participants responded so well that some more challenging things were taught to them on the next day.

The exhibition and valediction programme of Rangotsav was on 26 July 2013. In the valediction function Mrs Dharitri Panda, ICAS, Senior Financial Advisor, ICMR, Govt. of India was the Chief Guest and Mrs. Shashi Prabha Tiwari, an eminent journalist and dance critic along with Dr. Reena Dey, Scientist-C & H.O. of NMNH graced the occasion as distinguished guests.
